JPC Innovation and Technology Competition 2024-25

Competition Guideline

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(I) Brief Details of the Competition

Introduction

The Junior Police Call (JPC) has been committed to providing a wide range of activities and training for young people over the years. In 2021, a new strategy—IDEAS@JPC—was introduced, where 'I' stands for Innovation, 'D' for Discipline, 'E' for Exposure, 'A' for Adventure and 'S' for Synergy. JPC has also introduced the annual JPC Award Scheme to encourage young people to participate in various activities, nurturing more young leaders to fight crime together.

To suit the needs of students, align with the development trends of STEAM education and promote the development of innovative thinking activities under the new strategy of JPC, JPC has organised the annual JPC Innovation and Technology Competition since 2021, receiving widespread acclaim. Consequently, JPC will host the JPC Innovation and Technology Competition 2024-25 (the Competition) from November this year to February next year. Divided into three phases learning; competition; and award presentation and exhibition, the Competition will continue to be based on the concept of a "Smart City", allowing primary and secondary school students to propose innovative and feasible solutions through experiential learning.

Objective

The Competition aims to provide a suitable platform for students to engage in experiential learning and propose innovative and feasible solutions to put the concept of a "Smart City" into practice. It has also incorporated more policing and hi-tech elements including community safety, fraud prevention and crime fighting, youth drug prevention, artificial intelligence, and gerontechnology, which not only help students gain a better understanding of police work but also allow them to express their creativity and work together to prevent and combat crime.

Enrolment Details

Students can register to participate in the Competition by the following means:

 - in-person delivery to police stations in various districts (addressed to the Police Community Relations Office); or
 - Group enrolment and submission (enrolment form collected by and submitted via schools or organizations):
 - Participants can directly pass the completed enrolment forms to the representatives of the schools or organizations (if any) who will submit the enrolment forms on their behalf. No further online enrolment is required.

The 'JPC Innovation and Technology Competition 2024-25 Enrolment Form' must be clearly marked on the envelope containing the completed enrolment form. The closing date for enrolment is <u>7 February 2025 (12:00 noon)</u> (date of postmark no later than the deadline). Participants who have successfully made an enrolment will receive a confirmation email bearing their Entry Number (on or before 7 February 2025).

(IV) Competition Entries

Submission of Entries

Participants who have enrolled in the competition must submit the following entries according to their categories:

Junior Primary School Category – Creative Design Drawing (A3 Size) and the Brief Description Form (Annex A)

Note: Participants can make use of their innovative thinking skills to present on drawing paper anyone of the themes of community safety, fraud prevention and crime fighting, youth drug prevention, artificial intelligence, and gerontechnology in the form of drawing. This is an opportunity for them to promote and share their ideas and vision for the themes with the public.

Enrolment Rules:

- 1. Participants must be daytime primary one to three students from Hong Kong primary schools or Greater Bay Area JPC School Club;
- 2. This category is open to individual participants only, i.e. no team enrolments are allowed. The Creative Design Drawing (A3 Size) (the Drawing), including both the conception and the drawing, must be completed by the participants on their own;

- 3. The Drawing must be done on a drawing paper of A3 size [42 cm x 29.7 cm (+/-2 cm)];
- 4. Participants are free to adopt any form (e.g. oil painting, Chinese painting and crayon drawing are all acceptable), style and materials for the Drawing, as long as the entries are two-dimensional drawings. Other types of art or handicraft, including three-dimensional entries, will be rejected;
- 5. After completing the Drawing, participants should also complete the Brief Description Form (Annex A) (100 300 words) introducing the underlying concept; and
- 6. The Brief Description Form can be either completed with a ballpoint pen or electronically in a Microsoft Word file (in .doc or .docx format) and printed out afterwards. (E-version of the Brief Description Form in Microsoft Word format could be downloaded here)

Judging Criteria:

The following kinds of entries will not be considered:

• Works that are i) plagiarized; ii) inconsistent with the size specified; iii) found to contain copyrighted images; iv) submitted without the Entry Number displayed on the item (except group submission); and v) three-dimensional will be disqualifited.

Submission Guidelines:


For Creative Design Drawings (A3 Size) (the Drawing) in the Junior Primary School Category, participants must submit the completed Drawings and the Brief Description Form together before the deadline for entry submission. Entries have to be submitted by the following means (No online submission will be accepted):

- 1. mail (Address: Team 3, JPC Section, Public Relations Wing, 15F, Revenue Tower, 5 Gloucester Road, Wan Chai, Hong Kong, date of postmark no later than the deadline);
- 2. in-person delivery to the JPC Innovation and Technology Competition 2024-25 entries collection box during office hours (at the reception on 1/F, Arsenal House, Police Headquarters, 1 Arsenal Street, Wan Chai, Hong Kong); or
- 3. in-person delivery to police stations in various districts (addressed to the Police Community Relations Office).
- 4. Group Enrolment and Submission (collected by and submitted via schools or organizations):
 - Participants can directly pass the completed enrolment form and the Creative Entries to the representatives of the schools or organizations. Then the representatives will submit the enrolment forms on their behalf.
 - Participants can directly pass the completed enrolment form, together with the
 completed Drawing and the Brief Description Form (no need to fill in the Entry
 Number), to the representatives of the schools or organizations (if any), who will
 make the submission on their behalf. No further online enrolment is required.

Submission Notes:

- No further online enrolment is required for participants who submit their entries via schools or organizations;
- If the Drawing comes with packaging, it must be clearly marked the 'JPC Innovation and Technology Competition 2024–25 Junior Primary School

• The Brief Description Form showing the Entry Number (except group submission's participants), the name of the entry, and the name of the participant must be affixed properly to the centre of the back of the Drawing as shown in the following illustration:



The Brief Description Form should be attached to the centre of the back of the Drawing

Senior Primary School, Junior Secondary School and Senior Secondary School Categories – Project Report (Annex B), Creative Entry and Explainer Video

Note: Participants are required to choose a theme from such topics as community safety, fraud prevention and crime fighting, youth drug prevention, artificial intelligence, and gerontechnology. Making use of their STEAM-related knowledge and skills to conduct research on the chosen theme, they then have to create new products or technologies with practical applications, or produce functional physical models scaled proportionally. They also have to write reports and create short videos documenting the research, experimentation and investigation processes, so that they can share what they have learnt with the public.

Enrolment Rules:

- 1. Participants must be daytime primary four to secondary six students from Hong Kong primary and secondary schools or Greater Bay Area JPC School Club;
- 2. These categories are open to individuals and teams (no more than five members in each team). The entire process including research, creation and production of physical models must be completed by the participant(s) and teammates on their own;
- 3. The Project Report should be submitted together with the Explainer Video introducing the entry before the entry submission deadline. The Explainer Video has to be marked with the same Entry Number.
- 4. The Creative Entry should conform to the dimensions of 60 cm in length by 60 cm in width by 60 cm in height (+/- 2 cm). JPC staff should be informed if the Creative Entry exceeds the size specified;
- 5. Participants have to make a short video to introduce their completed Creative Entries. The short video should be in mp4 or mov format, no larger than 100MB in file size and no longer than three minutes in length, with Chinese or English commentary introducing the Creative Entries;
- 6. In writing up the Project Report (Annex B), participants must complete the following sections: Entry Description in Section A (between 100 and 300 words) and Subject of Study in Section B (not more than 3,000 Chinese characters / 3,500 English words). Additional information is not necessary;
- 7. The Project Report, which should give a brief description of the underlying concept and a detailed explanation about the Creative Entry, can be either completed with a ballpoint pen or electronically in a Microsoft Word file (in .doc or .docx format) and printed out afterwards (e-version of the Project Report can be downloaded here);
- 8. The Creative Entry must not violate the law or undermine the public interest; and

Entry Submission Method:

Participants from the Senior Primary School, Junior Secondary School and Senior Secondary School Categories who have enrolled in the competition and received an Entry Number must submit their completed Project Report (Annex B) and Explainer Video by the submission deadline in the following manner. Shortlisted participants are required to bring their Creative Entries to the Police Officers' Club (Address: 28 Hong Hing Road, Causeway Bay, Hong Kong) on <u>8 March 2025</u> to attend the judging session, and they must submit their Creative Entries to JPC staff after the judging activity is completed.

JPC Website:

Upload the completed Project Report (Annex B) in Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx) electronic format (no larger than 20MB in file size) and the Explainer Video in mp4 or mov format (no larger than 100MB in file size) to the JPC website (https://www.jpcitc.hk).

(V) Points to Note

- 1. JPC will notify and contact participants via email (for purposes including but not limited to invitations to attend activities related to the Competition and providing submission methods for the Creative Entry). Participants must ensure that they clearly fill in a frequently used email address during registration and check their inbox regularly;
- 2. Participants who upload their entries to the JPC website will receive a confirmation email to acknowledge the receipt of their entries (on or before <u>7 February 2025</u>);
- 3. Failure to submit Creative Design Drawing, Brief Description Form, Project Report and Explainer Video that comply with requirements by the submission deadline will lead to automatic disqualification from the Competition. Disqualified participants will not receive a certificate of participation;
- 4. Entries must be based on the research that began in or after <u>February 2023</u>, i.e. within two years before the closing of enrolment of the Competition;
- 5. Entries that had participated in the second and third JPC Innovation and Technology Competition held in 2022 and 2023 and won the Champion/First Runner-up/Second Runner-up prize will not be accepted for re-entry, except those which had been significantly modified or optimized;
- 6. Each entry must be submitted with a unique Entry Number specified in the confirmation email from JPC (except group enrolment and submission of entries which are collected

by and submitted via schools or organizations);

- 7. If the space provided in Annexes A and B is insufficient, participants may continue to fill out their reports on additional A4 paper;
- 8. JPC shall not be responsible for any postal damage to the entries;
- 9. Participants should consider in-person submission at the JPC Section of entries which are structurally complex or fragile;
- 10. JPC will try its best to handle all entries with care and shall not be responsible for any damage or loss during the processing;
- 11. After reviewing the uploaded reports and videos, JPC will individually notify and invite shortlisted participants from Senior Primary School, Junior Secondary School and Senior Secondary School Categories to bring their Creative Entries to the Police Officers' Club (Address: 28 Hong Hing Road, Causeway Bay, Hong Kong) on <u>8 March</u> 2025 to attend the judging event. Shortlisted participants must submit their Creative Entries to JPC staff after the judging activity is completed;
- 12. Participants are advised to keep an electronic copy of the submitted materials which will not be returned after the conclusion of the Competition;
- 13. Participants are required to provide clear and accurate personal details, including their JPC Membership Numbers, if any. JPC has the right to disqualify any participant for supplying false or erroneous information;
- 14. JPC owns the copyright of all entries, which may be used in part or in full on any occasions including but not limited to internal circulation, public display, publication and/or other purposes;
- 15. JPC has the right to reject or disqualify any entry that is irrelevant to the theme and objective of the Competition;
- 16. JPC reserves the right to amend the rules and other details of the Competition and will provide relevant updates of the Competition on the JPC website and other JPC social media platforms from time to time;
- 17. Should there be any disputes, JPC will have the final authority to interpret the rules and make the final decision on the results of the Competition;
- 18. JPC shall not be responsible for any disputes related to intellectual property rights arising from the submitted entries; and
- 19. All JPC members participating in the Competition can get points for 'I' Innovation under the JPC Award Scheme 2025 as an encouragement. Participants in Junior Primary School Category will be awarded 50 points, while those from the Senior Primary School to Senior Secondary School Categories will be awarded 150 points. Should there be any disputes regarding points allocation, JPC will have the authority to make a final decision.
