小虎説:「疼痛日子不好過,但看到在外執 勤的同袍, 內心更不好過, 因為受了傷, 無法跟 他們並肩上前線。不過,這些傷痛讓我變得更 強,令我明白要面對現實,既然暫時無法上前 線,便想想這次遭遇,能夠做得更好,甚至避免 發牛嗎? |

小虎於是成為了同袍和長官之間的另一 溝通渠道,他向前來探望他的長官反映了不 少前線人員面對的問題和裝備的需要等。 「現在回想,暴徒不僅是攻擊警察這麼簡 單,他們是要殺警察,希望我的不幸,能喚 起 大 家 的 警 覺 , 不 要 再 有 下 一 個 悲 <u>劇 發</u> 生。」

小虎受傷至今,一共接受了三個階段的 植皮手術及治療,每次都要面對極度痛楚的 煎熬,他可以一一捱過,也多得家人、同袍 和一眾長官,在行動和精神上的無限量支 持。

「留醫的日子,我仍十分留意警隊處理 反修例事件的工作,每次看到同袍無畏懼地 繼續為香港的安全及穩定出一分力,心裏都 會說一聲『多謝你們』。」小虎要多謝的, 還有很多曾經探望過和送他慰問卡的人,他 希望日後可以逐一親口説一聲「多謝」。

小虎特別感激處長鄧炳強,「留醫期

間,多位長官不止一次前來探望和關心我的 康復進度,鄧Sir甚至探望了三次之多。其中 一次更是去年十一月,他正式履新當天,早 上完成就職儀式,十一時已到醫院,向我說 了不少鼓勵説話。我十分感動,更想快些歸 隊,重返工作崗位。」

全式 路警區於三月十三日與港鐵公司在九龍港鐵站進 **主式** 行聯合反恐演習,以加強各前線單位的指揮及協 調能力,應對在鐵路系統發現可疑物品的情況。

演習模擬港鐵公司職員在九龍站一間閒置的客務 中心內發現一個可疑物品。鐵路警區(大嶼山及機場 線)人員隨即於現場設立事件指揮中心,與港鐵公司 人員進行協調及疏散工作。鐵路應變部隊人員迅速到 達現場進行掃蕩,並在月台上發現第二

個可疑物品。其後,鐵 路應變部隊人員設 置內圍封鎖,並確 保其他增援部隊安全 淮入現場。

跨部門反恐專責 組以及消防處的代表 獲邀在場觀察演習。他 們一致認為演習有助加 強前線人員的應變和協 調能力,以處理發生在鐵 路系統上的突發事件。

二月十六日至三月二十日期間,觀 塘警區人員合共發出一萬三千多張定額 罰款通知書。除了每三十分鐘再次向違

例車輛發出定額罰款通知書外, 警區人 員亦採取不同策略,其中警民關係組人 員會在可行的情況下致電車主,提示他 們若車輛繼續違例停泊會有可能被拖 走。警區行動主任指出,當司機看見附 近有拖車候命時,他們意識到警方打擊 違例泊車的強硬立場,會馬上駕車離 開。此外,警區亦透過傳媒簡報,向市 民展示警方打擊違例泊車的決心。

是次行動取得顯著成效,有助改善 交通情況,並獲得區內市民和觀塘區撲 滅罪行委員會的肯定。

因應2019冠狀病毒病的疫情,教育局早前宣布全港學校停課。有見及此,警區學校聯絡主任透過學校內聯網及網上學習平台,向深水埗區內超過五十二間中小學發放最新的防罪資訊,尤其是關於網上購買口罩及網上情緣的詐騙手法,從而提醒家長和學生慎防罪案。

Inter-departmental CT exercise simulates bomb attack

The Inter-departmental Counter Terrorism Unit (ICTU) conducted a counter-terrorism (CT) exercise, codenamed "CATCHMOUNT", at the Lok Ma Chau Spur Line Control Point on March 20. The exercise simulated an operation against extremists who plotted a bomb attack at a boundary control point in Hong Kong using improvised explosive devices (IED). Over 250 officers from the Hong Kong Police Force (HKPF), the Fire Services Department (FSD), the Customs and Excise Department (C&ED) and the Immigration Department (ImmD) took part in the exercise.

Speaking to the media prior to the exercise, Senior Superintendent of the ICTU Chu Man-lung said there were a number of recent cases involving IEDs. Among which, a radio-controlled IED had been placed at a crowded location which would have resulted in severe casualties



should there be an explosion. Mr Chu further pointed out that the behaviour of these violent extremists was very close to terrorist attacks commonly seen in other countries. Members of the public were advised to stay vigilant and beware of an emerging "homegrown terrorism" threat.

The exercise comprised two sessions. The first session was staged at the public transport interchange at the Lok Ma Chau

Spur Line Control Point. A man detonated a radio-controlled bomb in a rubbish bin, resulting in multiple casualties. The area was then cordoned off for rescue and investigation by officers from the HKPF and the FSD who sped to the scene.

In the second session, officers of the C&ED and the ImmD discovered another suspicious object at the departure hall. Evacuation was immediately conducted in

Through this exercise, Police aimed to highlight how extreme violence posed serious threat to public safety and to heighten public vigilance and awareness of suspicious objects. The exercise also served to enhance the co-ordination and response capabilities between Police units and other member departments of the ICTU for better protecting the life and property of the public.

是次演習分兩個部分進行。第一部分模擬於落馬洲支線管制站的 公共運輸交匯處內,一名男子在垃圾桶內放置一枚遙控炸彈,引爆後 造成多人傷亡。警隊與消防處人員迅速到場,封鎖現場進行 救援和調查。

第二部分則模擬爆炸案發生後,海關和入境事務處人員 於離境大堂發現另一件可疑物品。人員隨即安全有序地疏散現 場人群,並由警隊爆炸品處理課人員到場處理。

警隊期望透過演習,讓公眾了解極端暴力手段對公共安全的嚴重威脅,提高市民大眾對可疑物品的警惕和防範,並加強警隊各部門與專責組成員部門處理爆炸品的協調和應變能力,切實保障市民生命財產的安全。



JPC@ Pat Heung Quarantine Centre opens

arlier, the Police had offered to relinquish use of the Junior Police Call Permanent Activity Centre (JPC@Pat Heung) to the Government, so the premises could be used as a quarantine centre. The first phase of the conversion of the JPC@ Pat Heung has already been completed and the converted sections were officially handed over to the Department of Health (DH) on March 31 for quarantine purposes. In the first phase, four separate sections have been built, which can provide a total of 88 units.

In the second phase of conversion, an additional 120 modular houses will be built on the playground. Construction is expected to be completed by the end of April and the houses will then be handed over to the DH. The quarantine centre will be managed by the Civil Aid Service, while the Police will offer assistance. Readers may scan the QR code to view a video.

In view of the ongoing class suspension announced by the Education Bureau due to the outbreak of COVID-19, the Road Safety Office of Traffic New Territories South (NTS) Region has coordinated with several primary schools and kindergartens in the region to provide e-classes to enhance students' road safety knowledge.

RCPO KE disseminates crime prevention information

In view of a spate of theft from vehicle cases targeting taxi drivers in Kowloon East in February, officers of Regional Crime Prevention Office of Kowloon East (RCPO KE) have approached the Hong Kong Taxi Owners' Association to broadcast a pre-recorded audio message through the association's taxi call centre. The message alerted about 1 500



the prevalent modus operandi of theft from vehicle cases where perpetrators would distract drivers and steal their belongings

In addition, officers have liaised with the Hong Kong Taxi Council, the Taxi Drivers and Operators Association as well as various taxi companies with a view to spreading pertinent crime prevention information to other taxi drivers.

RCPO KE will continue to monitor crime trends, maintain close liaison with stakeholders and step up crime prevention measures in order to keep our community safe.

DTET STDIST takes stringent enforcement actions

District Traffic Enforcement Team of Shatin District (DTET STDIST) has resumed its operation since mid-March 2020 to support frontline units and take stringent enforcement and ticketing actions against drivers for illegal parking in the district.

During the STDIST Traffic Days between March 17 and 19, DTET STDIST took stringent enforcement and ticketing actions against offending drivers, particularly those involved in double parking, illegal parking at restricted zones (especially near bus stops and pedestrian crossing facilities) and

obstruction of vehicular access in the district. A total of 5 470 fixed penalty tickets were issued during the operation.

DTET STDIST will continue to work with all divisions and District Traffic Team of STDIST as well as different stakeholders, to target traffic black spots with a view to improving the traffic condition in the district. Moreover, DTET STDIST will step up enforcement actions, publicity and education to raise the awareness of road safety, protect all road users and maintain smooth traffic flow in the district.

KTDIST combats illegal parking in business area

Since February 16, Kwun Tong District (KTDIST) has taken stringent enforcement actions to tackle illegal parking and traffic congestion in the business area of the district. As at March 20, over 45 vehicles have been towed away without warning. According to the District Operations Officer of Kwun Tong District (DOO KTDIST), these vehicles not only caused serious obstruction, but also inconvenience to other road users. It was hoped that through strict enforcement actions, drivers would be more considerate to the needs of other road users.

Between February 16 and March 20, more than 13 000 fixed penalty tickets have been issued in the area. Apart from issuing a ticket to offending vehicles every 30 minutes, KTDIST has also adopted other tactics to combat illegal parking. Where possible, officers of the Police Community Relations Office would call the drivers to inform them that their vehicles could be towed if they remain illegally parked. DOO KTDIST said, "When the drivers saw a tow truck in the vicinity, they noted the tough stance of the Police and drove away their vehicles immediately." In addition, KTDIST officers have conducted

media briefings to demonstrate their determination to tackle illegal parking.

The operation has a chieved positive outcomes, with an improved traffic flow being noted by the public and members of Kwun Tong District Fight Crime Committee.

Retired magistrate shares knowledge with frontline officers

To support the Force's knowledge management (KM) framework, Tsuen Wan District (TWDIST) initiated "Project GUIDINGSTAR" to implement regional KM initiatives with the objective of fulfilling the Force's strategic direction of "Preparing the workforce to meet emerging challenges".

In March, Mr Lambert Lee Ka-chai, a retired magistrate, was invited by TWDIST to conduct a knowledge sharing session with frontline officers. Before his retirement, Mr Lee took up various public duties including serving in the Obscene Articles Tribunal and the Labour Tribunal, as well as serving as the Chairman of the Mental Health Review Tribunal. The sharing session was facilitated by Assistant

District Commander of TWDIST (Auxiliary) Leung Po-sang, a practising barrister-at-law, who also shared his experience from his profession's point of view.

The sharing session included

good practices such as points to note during applications of search warrants in relation to real-life experiences that Mr Lee had encountered during his 20 years of service in the Judiciary. After the sharing session, Mr Lee also met with TWDIST crime officers and encouraged them to continue serving Hong Kong with honour, duty and loyalty.

Over 80 regular and auxiliary officers from various districts attended the event. Acting Assistant Divisional Commander of Chai Wan Division (Auxiliary) Leung Honwai, a practising solicitor, noted that the sharing session enabled auxiliary officers to contribute to the Force's KM development.





RAILDIST and MTRC

conduct CT exercise

Railway District (RAILDIST) and Mass Transit Railway Corporation (MTRC) conducted a counter-terrorism (CT) exercise at Kowloon Station on March 13 to enhance the command and co-ordination capabilities of frontline units in responding to suspicious object found incidents on the railway system.

The exercise simulated a scenario in which the MTRC staff found a suspicious object inside an idled customer service centre at Kowloon Station. Officers from Lantau and Airport Rail of RAILDIST immediately set up a Forward Control Point to co-ordinate with MTRC and conduct the station evacuation. The Railway Response Team (RRT) swiftly arrived and conducted a thorough sweeping in the station and located another suspicious device. RRT officers set

up an inner cordon and provided support to assist other reinforced units to proceed to the scene safely.

Observers from the Interdepartmental Counter Terrorism Unit and the Fire Services Department were invited to the exercise. They agreed that the exercise had helped strengthen the response capabilities and interoperability of frontline officers in tackling untoward incidents on the railway system.

ISW achieves ISO re-certification

In order to ensure the information security of the Force is up to the highest international standard, the Force employs an independent party to audit its Information Security Management System (ISMS) every two years to benchmark with ISO/IEC 27001.

Since 2011, the Information Systems Wing (ISW) has successfully implemented the ISMS under ISO/IEC 27001. The certification proves the effective implementation of the ISMS in the Force and reassures public confidence in the Force's governance on information security.

In early 2020, the ISW successfully passed the re-certification

audit by an accredited certification body that assessed its provision of information security management framework for the Force, including establishment and implementation of security policies and governance services. The re-certification affirms the effectiveness of our ISMS and demonstrates the Force's continuous efforts on information systems governance and data protection.

To help control the spread of COVID-19, the Police have been conferred the power to enforce new laws, and have been actively assisting the Department of Health (DH) with tasks related to disease prevention, quarantine and prosecution.

Since the outbreak of the disease, police officers have been assisting with quarantine-related tasks at boundary control points and quarantine centres. They have also been carrying out spot checks on persons under compulsory quarantine orders. Besides, the Police have set up a contingent to fight the disease and activated the Major Incident Investigation and Disaster Support System to help monitor the spread of the virus. Simultaneously, the Police have mounted intelligence-led operations to combat scammers who try to capitalise on the epidemic.

The Police have been actively supporting the work of the DH. The Police have located a number of persons in violation of the quarantine order and arranged for them to be sent to the quarantine centres. With the help from the Police, the DH has successfully prosecuted a number of persons for violating quarantine orders.

Since the epidemic has shown no signs of slowing down, the Government has earlier implemented newly added regulations under the Prevention and



Control of Disease Ordinance (Cap. 599). The Police will enforce the relevant laws and follow up on reports from citizens, as well as carrying out spot checks on eateries and other designated premises in conjunction with other departments.

More than half a year has passed since the attack, and Little Tiger has undergone three major operations. Although he has not fully recovered vet. he possesses formidable stamina and the safety of his colleagues has always

"I saw my pale skin turning brown, blistering and oozing bloody discharge. The pain was excruciating." Later on, Little Tiger received treatment in hospital, but since his body responded to anaesthetics rather slowly and that regular painkillers did not even have any effect on

Instead, Little Tiger chose to grin and bear it, tolerating the pain during the treatment solely by his willpower. To him, the most hurtful thing was that when he insisted on going to the toilet by himself during the initial stage of recovery, it took him more than half an hour to get off the bed and inch his way to the toilet, a process that usually takes only a few minutes.

Little Tiger said, "The days spent in pain were no picnic, but I gradually got through those days. What's even more painful is seeing my colleagues on duty outside but not being able to work with them on the front line because of my injuries. However, such pain has made me even stronger, and prompted me to face the reality. Since I cannot return to the front line yet, I have reflected on this experience to see if I could have done better, or even averted the danger in the first place."

In fact, Little Tiger has become another communication channel between his colleagues and senior management, as he conveyed to the senior officers who visited him the various issues facing frontline officers as well as their need for certain gear. "Now that I think

about the violent attacks again, I believe the rioters were not just assaulting police officers. They actually wanted to kill police officers. I hope my misfortune can alert everyone to the dangers, so there will never be another tragedy.'

"During my time in hospital, I was still following the Police's handling of the protests against the extradition law amendment bill very closely. Whenever I saw my colleagues continuing to do their part bravely to ensure the safety and stability of Hong Kong, I thanked them from the bottom of my heart." Little Tiger would also like to express his gratitude to the many people that had visited him or given him greeting cards, and he hopes he can say "thank you" to each of them in person one day.

Little Tiger is particularly indebted to Commissioner Tang Ping-keung. He said, "When I was staying in hospital, many senior officers visited me more than once to check on the progress of my recovery. Tang Sir even visited me as many as three times-once was even on the day he assumed the role of Commissioner in November last year. After his inauguration ceremony in the morning, Tang Sir still made it to the hospital at 11am and gave me many words of encouragement. I was deeply moved by that, and my desire to rejoin my teammates and resume my duties became even more fervent."
